
An opportunity to change or modify your Qualifying Journey plans and details with your Supervisor. The debrief should be completed as soon as possible after your Practice Journey.

What did you do?	 We walked around downtown Calgary and looked at how accessible stores and restaurants are. We took pictures of the automatic door buttons, ramps, etc. and talked to staff and patrons about things aisle width, accessible tables, bathrooms and change rooms. 	
What went well? What are you proud of?	 We ended up visiting more stores than we planned, which gave us a better idea of the accessibility of the city. What was challenging? (for individuals and the team)	 We were a little socially awkward at first. Each of us would talk to the staff but it was uncomfortable. Everyone felt that way. We also didn't enjoy the rain, it made note taking and finding an outdoor lunch spot harder as well. The hostel was a noisy place, so sleep wasn't the best either at night. But we got through it! 	

Did you accomplish your team goal?	 We all feel like we accomplished the goal. We exceeded our number of places to visit, we got lots of info and data. Some locations we went to even wanted to see our results so they could improve!
What would you do differently for future journeys?	 We'd pack more snacks and versatile meal options. We didn't want to buy food while walking around because of how expensive it can be, but we had to at one point because we just didn't have enough food with us.
What stood out? What did you learn? What are your take-aways from this experience?	 We learned a lot about the city and how some people get around with mobility aids. It was eye opening to see how they can struggle with something like the button location or a couple inches to step up. We have a new appreciation for the need for accessible stores, restaurants and city infrastructure.
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This AJ was a great experience. We met some lovely people, we learned a lot about our city and ultimately, we found we worked really well together, even under stress and uncomfortable circumstances. Everyone should look closer at the ways stores and cities make their locations accessible to all!
